

The Bard and the Bulldog

Day group visit to Blenheim Palace and Shakespeare's Birthplace. The Bard and the Bulldog itinerary enables your group to visit two of Britain's finest attractions in one day. Visit Shakespeare's Birthplace in Stratford-upon-Avon in the morning and travel through the beautiful, scenic Cotswolds to Blenheim Palace in the afternoon. Morning

The day starts in Stratford-upon-Avon with a visit to the birthplace of the world's greatest dramatist and poet William Shakespeare. At Shakespeare's Birthplace you will see the family rooms decorated and furnished as Shakespeare would have known them as a boy. Costumed guides demonstrate the ancient craft of glove-making as practised by Shakespeare's father. Watch a brief performance of Shakespeare Aloud!, which are about bringing Shakespeare off the page and onto the stage, whether that stage be an outdoor play, a room in one of the Shakespeare Houses, or in the beautiful Shakespeare gardens. To give your experience a special focus or the exclusive touch, book the 45 minute 'All About Shakespeare' talk or a 'Hidden Treasures' display which enables you to enjoy a privileged viewing of some of the glorious treasures held in the Trust's Library and Archive collections.

Lunch

Enjoy a lunch in a café, bar or one of Stratford-upon-Avon's many centrally located restaurants. The RSC Courtyard Theatre Café Bar caters for groups and serves a range of light meals including sandwiches and meat or vegetarian dishes. Tantalise your taste buds at Othello's Bar and Brasserie in Stratford-upon-Avon, which is part of the Mercure Shakespeare Hotel. Othello's Bar and Brasserie offers an exciting mix of modern European and traditional English dishes.

Afternoon

After lunch the group boards the coach to make the 50 minute journey to Blenheim Palace, which is situated 8 miles from Oxford. This journey takes you through the picturesque Cotswolds, awarded the status of an 'Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty', with its rolling grasslands, beech woods and captivating villages, an area of warmth and clarity with stone walls and buildings. Blenheim Palace is the home of the 11th Duke of Marlborough and the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill. The palace is a masterpiece of English Baroque architecture, surrounded by over 2,000 acres of 'Capability' Brown landscaped parkland. It was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987. A new permanent experience, Blenheim Palace: the Untold Story has opened upstairs in the palace. This takes a closer look at the dramatic history of the family who have lived at Blenheim Palace over the last 300 years. After visiting the palace the group can enjoy the formal gardens and the spectacular parkland before boarding the coach for the return journey.

NASH'S HOUSE and NEW PLACE Nash's House was owned by Shakespeare's granddaughter Elizabeth and adjoins the site of New Place where Shakespeare's story ended in 1616.
